
Dozens of people showed up to peruse the conservancy's stock of fancy and vintage hats.

grateful for the funds raised by the event," said McCauley.

McCauley is looking forward to this year's Derby Day, noting that tickets are set to go on sale on Tuesday, April 1. The fun begins on Saturday, May 7 at 4:30 p.m.

"Derby Day is the Conservancy's only fundraiser of the year, designed to raise funds for our operational costs. Membership dues are the largest percentage of our annual budget, and Derby Day helps us meet the budgeted goal every year," said McCauley.

The Madison-Morgan Conservancy's Derby Day was named one of the eight best Derby Parties in the country, two years running.

According to the conservancy's press release, "Bonar Hall, a c. 1839 13-acre estate, is the ideal location for the Conservancy's annual event. This grand ante-bellum home is an architectural gem and has undergone little modification since being built.

Current owners, Betsy Wagenhauser and Alex Newton, have recently restored the house and continue to refine the landscape, which includes tree-lit grounds, a formal boxwood garden, and historic dependencies, through which party-goers meander. Derby Day 2016 includes a tour of Bonar Hall, live streaming of the Kentucky Derby, Bourbon tastings, a beer garden, delicious Derby Supper by Epting Events, live auction, best dressed and best hat competitions..."
